WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (Nov. 1, 2019) – Colonial Williamsburg offers select pass members discounted Single-day admission for up to 10 visiting friends and relatives during November.

Annual, Good Neighbor and Collegiate pass members can purchase Single-day adult ticket admission for only \$22.50 and youth admission for only \$12.50 November 1-30. Single-day tickets normally retail at \$44.99 for adults and \$24.49 for youths ages 6-12. Discounted tickets purchased through the "Bring a Friend" promotion must be redeemed by or on November 30.

A Colonial Williamsburg ticket grants access to Colonial Williamsburg's Historic Area and regular programs, homes, historic trades and gardens and the Art Museums of Colonial Williamsburg.

To qualify for the "Bring a Friend" special offer, pass members and friends and family must be present and show a current adult Annual, Good Neighbor or Collegiate pass. Guests may not purchase a member pass and discounted friend and family tickets on the same day.

This Colonial Williamsburg discount is available at on-site ticket locations: the Colonial Williamsburg Regional Visitor Center, the Lumber House Ticket Office, the William Pitt Store and Merchants Square Ticket Office. These offers cannot be combined with any other discounts.
