WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (Sept. 14, 2021) – Colonial Williamsburg invites the community to celebrate the 234th anniversary of the signing of the U.S. Constitution with a <u>free</u> <u>event</u> on Friday, Sept. 17, on the lawn in front of the Art Museums from 6-7:30 p.m. "To Support and Defend," will bring America's governing document to life through music and the spoken word.
